


Do any of these describe you?

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Connecting With History

4-Year Cycle

Connecting with History uses a four-year cycle spanning all of history from creation through modern times.

The advantages of using a cyclic approach include:

- History is studied chronologically which promotes an understanding of the story of history as it unfolds through God's plan
- Younger children can join in at any point in the cycle knowing that the family will cycle back through time periods they may have missed
- Repetition reinforces learning and understanding.
- Each time the family begins a new cycle the students will be older and able to study in more depth than the previous cycle.

The four cycles of Connecting with History are...

Year One:

Old Testament and Ancient History

Year Two:

New Testament and early Medieval

Year Three:

High Medieval, Renaissance, Reformation, Missionaries and Explorers

Year Four:

American History
